Jeff Reynolds has recently retired as Associate Professor, Teaching Stream, in Trumpet, Chamber Music,Music Education and Conducting at the Faculty of Music, University of Toronto. Formerly Coordinator of the Performance Division, he taught at the Faculty of Music for over 40 years, teaching instrumental education, chamber music, jazz education, jazz history, applied trumpet and conducting. He also conducted the Wind Symphony and Wind Ensemble. He joined the Faculty of Music after a career as a trumpet player with the Victoria Symphony, Calgary Philharmonic, Hamilton Philharmonic and the orchestra of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet among others. Jeff adjudicates at festivals across Canada and appears as a guest conductor and clinician. He has contributed articles to Canadian Winds, The Recorder, The Journal of Aesthetic Education and is the author of the trumpet pedagogy book, Trumpet for Dummies.

ISAAC YISAK SEO Grade 6 Piano

Canadian pianist and conductor Isaac Yisak Seo has performed in Palais des Beaux Arts in Brussels, Salle Pleyel in Paris, Place des Arts in Montreal, Paganini Hall in Italy, Koerner Hall in Toronto and more. Isaac was one of the two Canadian pianists to compete in the 2005 International Chopin Piano Competition in Poland and 2007 International Queen Elizabeth Competition in Belgium. He is a prize winner from the International Stepping Stone competition, International Flame Paris Competition, Toronto Kiwanis Music Festival, Montreal Symphony Competition OSM, Canadian Music Competition and more.

Isaac was a guest artist at the Orford Art Centre in Quebec and his programme including Chopin, Beethoven and Canadian Composer, Jaques Hetu was broadcasted on CBC Classical Radio Station.

Isaac has studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, Montreal University, Conservatory de Belgium. He received the Bachelors degree at the Juilliard School and Masters Degree from the Manhattan School of Music. Isaac's musical mentors include, Peter Longworth, Marc Durand, John Perry, Leon Fleisher, Jacques Rouvier, Yoheved Kaplinsky, Evegeny Moguilevsky, Phillip Kawin, Andre Laplante, Anton Kuerti, Alfred Brendel and Martha Argerich. Isaac's solo piano career has led him tp tour major halls in Paris, Rome, New York, Belgium, Atri, Toronto, Montreal and more.

As an adjudicator, he has adjudicated numerous music competitions including, OYMI competition, CMC (Canadian Music Competition), OMFA (Ontario Music Festivals Associations Provincials competition, New York Vocal competition, Young Arts Music Competition in New York, Unionville Music competition and conducted master classes and workshops.

As a Piano Pedagogue, his pupils have won prizes from Pre-college concerto competitions in NYC, CMC (Canadian Music Competition) in Toronto, Lincoln Center Debut competition in NYC, Junior-Bachauer in Utah, Toronto Kiwanis Music Festival, OYMI and a \$10,000 Scholarship from the National Young Arts Foundation Competition in the United States. His students have appeared as soloists with orchestras in New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and Toronto.

Isaac is the artistic director of the TKCC Toronto Korean Canadian Choir and conducts OYMI Youth Orchestra.

ALEXANDER MALIKOV ADVANCED PIANO

Pianist Alexander "Sasha" Malikov performs extensively across Canada and the United States both as a soloist and a chamber musician. Most recent highlights include Schoenberg's Pierrot Lunaire with the Happenstancers in Toronto, solo recitals in Austin, Texas, at Vancouver's Müzewest Concerts, and at Toronto's Arts & Letters Club. In 2021, he also recorded Beethoven's Cello Sonatas Nos. 2 & 5 with Joseph Johnson, principal cellist of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. He is a prize winner of the Knigge, Shean, Orchestre Symphonique de Montréal, Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Manhattan International and Carl E. Baldassare Composer-Performer Competitions.

As a teaching artist with a unique blend of passion and expertise, Alexander is committed to fostering a love for music while inspiring the next generation

of artists and audiences. In recognition of his dedicated approach to music education, Mr. Malikov was awarded the Young Arts Educator Award in Florida in 2020. He regularly teaches masterclasses across Canada and the United States and has studied piano pedagogy with Prof. Sophia Gilmson at the University of Texas at Austin.

Mr. Malikov is a graduate of the Juilliard School (MMus), Oberlin College (BMus), and the Cleveland Institute of Music. Upon completing a Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) degree at the University of Texas, Alexander went on to receive an Artist Diploma at the Glenn Gould School of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. His principal teachers have been Sergei Babayan, John Perry, James Anagnoson, Angela Cheng, Julian Martin and Anton Nel.
