Piano Concertos

Canadian pianist and conductor Isaac Yisak Seo has performed in Palais des Beaux Arts in Brussels. Salle Plevel in Paris. Place des Arts in Montreal. Paganini Hall in Italy, Koerner Hall in Toronto and more. Isaac was one of the two Canadian pianists to compete in the 2005 International Chopin Piano Competition in Poland and 2007 International Queen Elizabeth Competition in Belgium. He is a prize winner from the International Stepping Stone competition, International Flame Paris Competition, Toronto Kiwanis Music Festival, Montreal Symphony Competition OSM, Canadian Music Competition and more.

Isaac was a guest artist at the Orford Art Centre in Quebec and his programme including Chopin, Beethoven and Canadian Composer, Jaques Hetu was sbroadcasted on CBC Classical Radio Station.

Isaac has studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, Montreal University, Conservatory de Belgium. He received the Bachelors degree at the Juilliard School and Masters Degree from the Manhattan School of Music. Isaac's musical mentors include, Peter Longworth, Marc Durand, John Perry, Leon Fleisher, Jacques Rouvier, Yoheved Kaplinsky, Evegeny Moguilevsky, Phillip Kawin, Andre Laplante, Anton Kuerti, Alfred Brendel and Martha Argerich, Isaac's solo piano career has led him to tour major halls in Paris. Rome, New York, Belgium, Atri, Toronto, Montreal and more.

As an adjudicator, he has adjudicated numerous music competitions including, OYMI competition, CMC (Canadian Music Competition), OMFA (Ontario Music Festivals Associations Provincials competition, New York Vocal competition, Young Arts Music Competition in New York, Unionville Music competition and conducted master classes and workshops.

As a Piano Pedagogue, his pupils have won prizes from Pre-college concerto competitions in NYC, CMC (Canadian Music Competition) in Toronto, Lincoln Center Debut competition in NYC, Junior-Bachauer in Utah, Toronto Kiwanis Music Festival, OYMI and a \$10,000 Scholarship from the National Young Arts Foundation Competition in the United States. His students have appeared as soloists with orchestras in New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and Toronto.

Isaac is the artistic director of the TKCC Toronto Korean Canadian Choir and conducts OYMI Youth Orchestra.





MARKUS HOWARD

Community Choirs

As a conductor, director and choreographer, Markus Howard has worked extensively in the arts throughout Canada and abroad. He has appeared in 27 countries, working with musicians of varying ages, cultures and experiences. Conducting choirs and opera, and as a private voice teacher, Markus works in many musical genres including opera/oratorio, musical theatre, pop and jazz voice. His talents have been recognized by Yamaha Music Canada, the Swedish Ministry of Culture, the Ontario Arts Council, and the International Association of Jazz Educators. He has been nominated four times as a candidate finalist by the Ontario Arts Council for the Leslie Bell Prize for Excellence in Conducting. Mr. Howard pursues an active adjudicating schedule across North America, most recently overseeing Classical Voice and Music Theatre at the Federation of Canadian Music Festivals National Finals, Nova Scotia Provincial Finals for Voice and Choirs, and the Ontario Music Festivals

Provincial Finals. Markus retired as the Artistic Director for two of Ontario's most outstanding youth choir organizations, the award-winning Guelph Youth Singers and La Jeunesse Choirs, and concludes an eleven-year tenue leading the Oriana Singers of Cobourg, and as Interim Conductor for London Pro Musica Choir. He serves as the founding conductor of the professional chamber choir LA MOVIDA, and appears as guest conductor for advanced choirs around the province. In September of 2022, he took over the role of Artistic Director for the Durham Philharmonic Choir. Recent engagements include concerts with the Guelph Symphony Orchestra, and as conductor for the Handel opera, Alcina with Halifax Summer Opera. He held the position of Lead Artist Educator with the Canadian Opera Company, and was on the faculty of the Royal Conservatory of Music, Glenn Gould School and the Randolph Academy for the Performing Arts. His students grace opera and concert stages, including members of the Stratford and Shaw Festivals, Toronto's Lion King, Billy Elliott, The Producers, and Jersey Boys, and a number of Broadway and National Touring companies, and has worked as lead voice coach for Mirvish Production's Lion King School. At the University of Toronto, Markus directed the Hart House Jazz Choir and Massey College Choirs. Mr. Howard is a PROUD recipient of the Paul Harris Fellowship from Rotary International.



Carole Anderson is a life-long choral educator passionate about the transformative power of singing in community and enthusiastic about creating ecellent musical experiences for children and youth. Carole is the Artistic Director of Young Voices Toronto, a vibrant children and youth choir organization in Toronto's west end and currently conducting three of YVT's six ensembles.

During her 35-year teaching career Carole taught music at all grade levels and was a music consultant in both Brant and Peel Districts. Her middle school choral and concert band ensembles were recognized for excellence at local, regional, and national festivals. In 2012, Carole was recognized for her contributions to music education receiving an Honorary Life Membership from the Ontario Music Educators' Association.

From 2006 - 2020, Carole served as an Associate Conductor with the Toronto Children's Chorus (TCC) where she conducted three choirs. As a member of the TCC's Artistic Staff, Carole was part of 8 international and 2 national tours that covered Europe, South Africa, Russia and the Baltics, South America, Bahamas, New Zealand, Australia, and the USA.

Carole received her Bachelor of Music at Western University where she studied choral conducting with Deral Johnson. From 2013 - 2018, she was a member of the Board of Cirectors for Choirs Ontario, with responsibility for the Ontario Youth Choir. Carole continues to serve as a choral adjudicator, guest conductor, and guest lecturer.

Grades 3 Piano

In demand as an educator, lecturer and adjudicator, pianist Charles Lin's commitment of excellence in the field of piano pedagogy has led to local and international recognitions through his students' performances. In addition to giving workshops and masterclass, he is an active member with The Royal Conservatory of Music's College of Examiners, instructs Applied Music of Piano and Piano Pedagogy at the University of Toronto, and serves as the Director of the University of Toronto Piano Pedagogy Program (UTPPP). In his position at the UTPPP, Charles oversees the creation of a well-rounded musical experience for young beginners and provides graduate students with the opportunity to teach both group and private lessons. He maintains a successful studio with students as young as four years old.

Charles holds his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Toronto, under the tutelage of Marietta Orlov and Midori Koga; further studies in children's piano pedagogy with Irina

Gorin through The Gorin Institute. His early years studies were with Alexandra Munn at the Alberta College Conservatory of Music, and Janet Scott-Hoyt at the University of Alberta. He is the recipient of The Alberta Foundation for the Arts Grant, The University of Toronto Fellowship, and The Winspear Fund for Advanced Classical Music Studies.

Performance highlights include appearances at the 14th World Piano Pedagogy Conference in Phoenix, Arizona, the Toronto Summer Music Festival, the Canadian Chopin Festival, and the Academy at Centre d'arts Orford. He has performed as soloist with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and the Concordia University College Orchestra.



LANG-NING LIU GRADES 4 and 5 PIANO

An acclaimed piano virtuoso, Lang-Ning Liu brings an introspective approach to both the contemporary and classical repertoire, with performances that couple breathtaking technical mastery with noble musicianship. Anthony Tommasini of The New York Times hailed her as "a sensitive, extremely compelling artist", and praised her "elegant pianism, warmth and artistic maturity". Musical America has remarked on her "miraculous strength and confident breadth."

After winning several major prizes and prestigious awards, Ms. Liu's career has taken her throughout North America, Europe, and Asia, giving concerts in major venues around the globe. She has performed and recorded with the Prague Radio Symphony Orchestra, and for the Royal Conservatory of Music's Celebration Series Perspectives. Highlight performance engagements include soloist appearances with the Beijing Symphony Orchestra, Juilliard Symphony

Orchestra, New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, Juarez Symphony Orchestra, Southern Missouri Symphony, Louisiana Philharmonic, Slovak State Philharmonic Orchestra, Liaoning Symphony Orchestra, Toronto Concert Orchestra, Cathedral Bluffs Symphony, University of Toronto Wind Ensemble, and Chinese Artists Society of Toronto Orchestra. Ms. Liu makes frequent media appearances on radio, TV and in the media print in Canada's largest broadcast and publishing networks, as well as those abroad. Notable media appearances include Czech Television, CCTV China, CBC Music, CTV's Bravo! & CP24 TV, The WholeNote, Toronto Star, Fairchild TV, Rogers TV, OMNI TV, InsideToronto, Sing Tao Daily, M2TV, and numerous guest performances on the CFMZ-FM Classical 96.3 FM.

Ms. Liu passionately devotes herself to educational and artistic outreach endeavours, helping the community actively through numerous projects. Ms. Liu is a Faculty member of the Glenn Gould School and the Taylor Academy for Young Artists at the Royal Conservatory of Music. In 2013, she was appointed as a member of Board of Directors at the Chinese Cultural Centre of Greater Toronto (CCC) as their Advisor of Culture & Education. In 2010, she founded and served as the Artistic Director for the Toronto International Piano Competition and the CCC Music Festival. She has been an Advisory Board Member of the International Resource Centre for Performing Artists since 2011.

Ms. Liu entered the Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing with the highest honors at the age of 11. During her studies there, she made her orchestral debut with the Beijing Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Liu entered The Glenn Gould School in Toronto, where she began her undergraduate studies at age 17 on full scholarship, studying with Marietta Orlov. She completed her studies in Master of Music in Piano Performance at The Juilliard School in New York, under the tutelage of Julian Martin.






